

Mto Moyoni is a retreat centre on the banks of the river Nile in Uganda. Ingrid Wilts, a missionary, started this centre in 2003. In Swahili the name Mto Moyoni means: 'river trough the heart', and this name also expresses the goal of the centre: to offer Christian workers a time of peace and quiet to experience that the Spirit of Gods wants to flow like a river through their hearts. Ingrid works together with Winette Hubregtse. In Uganda Mto Moyoni is registered as an NGO. In the Netherlands their work is supported by the Friends of Mto Moyoni foundation.

Extra program in The Netherlands

We are often asked if Ingrid and Winette would be able to run a programme in the Netherlands, like those they run in Uganda.

In June 2010 we will organize the second time such program. It will be in a setting with no overnight accommodation, but with nearby facilities to stay. We expect a special and deep experience of the Fathers love!

This is the generation that will be important!

I greet you from a dry Jinja, where people are desperately waiting for the rains. The land is dry and the roads dusty. The rainy season should have started in August! Today a little rain fell and I hope it is the start of a wet season!

I received an unexpected phone call from CRO, the street children project that Ingrid started in the 90s. They asked if I could do a program for the holidays with the teenagers. One of our planned programs had been delayed, and so I had the time. Otim, our office assistant led the worship on those days. It was so good to be back! Every afternoon we had a time of worship; learning new songs, a time of interaction and soaking. It impressed me again to see that these kids can sit for one whole hour and enjoy it. That is really God! At the end of the second week the staff asked us if we could come back once a week to work with a group of five big boys, age 15-20, who are still on the street but like to hang around at CRO. With this group I would start today, but when we arrived also 40 younger kids were waiting with them. Some of them were just off the street but not yet in regular schools. They also wanted to join in. We offered the time to Father God and started soaking, praying words of Truth over them.

God's Presence was so strong; some were in tears, some were physically touched by a Father who will never let go of them. He is so good and His Goodness is forever! One of the boys came shyly to me and pointed at his heart: "Please pray for my heart too!"



If these children start to know about the heart of Father God they will become part of the worldwide army of children that God is preparing for the great harvest. This is the generation that will be important! These are the children the Father set apart from the beginning of the world. He chooses the lowest, to put them up high. Children who have nothing to lose, stand up in their identity, learn to receive straight from the Father and with that they win everything and overcome!

I see more and more why our youth centre is so important! It is on God's priority list! This week we are building the walls and the roof will follow soon!!

Philip and Emily Greene grew up as missionary kids in Africa. They met each other as students at Rift Valley Academy, a boarding school in Kenya. For the last 8 years they have lived in California but always felt God calling them to return to Africa. In the Spring of 2009 they oversaw the completion of a bridge construction-project in Southern Sudan and have now partnered with Mto Moyoni on the construction of the new Youth Center.

While looking after their two young children, Emily is also involved in various projects and training around the Retreat Center.

Philip told us: "We found a nice house here, with a River-view. The building is going very well. We found a good

foreman and sixteen laborers, carpenters and masons. They work hard and there was no theft of materials. We are so thankful for this all!"

The building is progressing.

Two dormitories are being built, each with 3 rooms for 8 people (a total of 48 beds). One building is for the boys and another for the girls. This week (September 2009), the walls are built and the window frames are installed.

We expect to be able to use the buildings for the first time later on this year. Until there is a conference hall for the meetings and teaching sessions, we plan to use one of the rooms in the dormitories or gather outside. In October 2009 André and Hanneke Fonteijn will visit Mto Moyoni, as representatives of the Dutch board of Mto Moyoni. For more details on the building progress, please check our website.
